Seat Belts

At our October meeting a question on seat belts was raised by a Delegate re the Government camera system introduced to take photos of seat belts not being used and mobile phones being used. These misdemeanours would incur a hefty fine and loss of points.

Cars prior to 1969 in Australia did not have seat belts fitted when manufactured. This means a number of our classic and historic cars did not have seat belts fitted.

On talking with a representative from Transport and Main Roads (TMR) he stated that all photos taken are cross referenced with the vehicles registration details and if the vehicle is prior to 1969 and no belts were fitted no further action would occur – the photo would be dismissed. However he did say if a photo was inadvertently processed and a summons was issued contact TMR and they will deal with it in your favour. Please let QHMC know if you do encounter a problem and we will contact TMR on your behalf.


100 Year Badge

FIVA Report

Jenny Fawbert, Web publisher from the Council of Heritage Motoring Clubs NSW (CHMC NSW) has given permission to print the condensed version in 3 articles of the FIVA Survey results 2020/2021. The results provide vital facts and figures to help argue for the protection of the future of our automotive heritage at a time of rapid change. The data can be put to good use when talking to politicians and sponsors.

The Survey:

1 revealed the movement's huge financial contribution to local and national economies,

- 2 confirmed the generally annual mileage of historic cars and motorcycles and
- 3 the significant contribution of clubs to the historic vehicle movement and society at large.
- The Survey has been arranged into 3 documents:
- 1 Heritage vehicle owners
- 2 Heritage vehicles
- 3 Heritage vehicle clubs
