EUROPEAN E-FUEL POLICY COULD SAVE HISTORIC VEHICLES

FIVA welcomed news that the use of carbonneutral e-fuels is now officially recognised in Europe as an important factor in tackling climate change. In recent years, FIVA member organisations have been actively studying the use of e-fuels and the results to date suggest these fuels work well in historic as well as modern vehicles.

FIVA welcomed the development because...

- It will encourage the commercial development of e-fuels, and encourage efuel manufacturers to provide e-fuel on a larger scale, which should lead to better availability and, we hope, lower prices, making it easier for historic vehicle owners to begin transitioning away from fossil fuels
- The availability of non-polluting fuels will help keep Europe's historic vehicles on the

- road long into the future, while reducing their impact on the environment
- The ongoing production of e-fuels will be important in other parts of the world where the internal combustion engine will still, by necessity, have a role to play for some time
- Ongoing trials by FIVA member organisations in Austria, France, Germany, Netherlands and the UK have already shown that e-fuels work well in historic engines and, as fossil fuels start to disappear from the mainstream market, owners are increasingly keen to embrace the use of clean, green alternatives.

Lars Genild, FIVA's Vice-President, Legislation Commission, said "This EU decision...will also help us keep our motoring heritage on the road, without making a negative impact on the carbon footprint.

FIVA YOUTH COMPETITION 2023

FIVA SEES WELCOME INCREASE IN YOUNGER ENTHUSIASTS

At its 2022 General Assembly, held in Sofia, Bulgaria, FIVA was delighted to see a marked increase in the proportion of younger historic vehicle enthusiasts attending — a shift that is essential to secure the future of the movement. "Spreading the word to the younger generation

is often seen as the race to win in the historic vehicle world," said FIVA president Tiddo Bresters. "At times, attracting younger enthusiasts has seemed a hard hill to climb. However, two factors have helped kick-start an extremely welcome change. First, by

embracing social media – often the chosen method of organising events and get-togethers for younger people – we've been able to welcome a significant lowering of the average age of enthusiasts participating in our events."

Tido went on to note that – "secondly, we are delighted to see the so-called 'emerging countries' of the international historic vehicle community bringing a whole swathe of younger people, often women, to the fold.

Among the 200-odd participants who joined us in Sofia (120 in person and the rest online), the vast majority of delegates from Morocco, Turkey, Mexico, India, and Central and Eastern Europe were under 50 years old, with many in

their 30s and 40s. It is often these countries also leading the drive to encourage more women to take a leading role. The national federations of Turkey, Romania and Cyprus, for example, have female presidents. In Iran, the rapid expansion of the historic vehicle movement is being driven by Instagram, thanks largely to the dedication of a knowledgeable and highly motivated young woman.

There is certainly a great deal we can learn from these countries – and I believe the historic vehicle movement has more reason for optimism than at any time in the recent past."

DID YOU KNOW?

- FIVA has formed a Working Group on e-Fuels, with representatives from several ANFs, to monitor e-fuel developments and testing on historic vehicles.
- ❖ FIVA is a Consultative Partner of the United Nations organisation ECOSOC, and through that, WP29, the Working Party for harmonization of global vehicle regulations a global platform on which FIVA hopes to promote historic vehicles as an exceptional category of vehicles on the roads of the world.
- FIVA has an agreement with FIA (Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile) to jointly lobby for appropriate regulations for historic vehicles to continue to access public roads.

- FIVA has a formal agreement with FIM (Fédération Internationale de Motocyclisme) to collaborate on sustainability, the Women in the Motorcycling Commission, the planned FIM Racing Heritage Register and joint events.
- FIVA and TICCIH (the International Committee for the Conservation of the Industrial Heritage) have an MOU to cover their joint efforts to promote shared heritage objectives.
- FIVA is actively getting young people more directly involved in its Commissions and project groups.
- FIVA is looking at ways to encourage "youngtimer" vehicle owners into historic motoring
